What is the Anchor Mobile Food Market (AMFM)?

AMFM is a fully-stocked grocery store on wheels that visits small communities that do not have a full-service grocery store. The store stops at one or two towns per day, typically near the downtown area, and opens for a few hours so shoppers can purchase their groceries. The store does not stop at each home; shoppers come to the AMFM location.

What towns are served by AMFM?

Currently the AMFM stops at Atlanta, Burden, Dexter and Udall. The market is evaluating these communities and additional stops in and around Cowley County.

How do I know when AMFM will be in my community?

The easiest way to find out the AMFM schedule is to follow their Facebook page @anchormobilefoodmarket. A permanent schedule will be set and announced soon. Flyers will also be posted in the communities with information on locations, dates and times.

Is it expensive to shop at AMFM?

No, the prices are competitively priced and mere pennies higher than the same products at the hub store, Save-A-Lot in Winfield.

Can I do all my shopping at AMFM?

The mobile market has a large selection of grocery items and continually adding more products based on customer feedback. Fresh meat, fresh produce, dairy and freezer items, pantry staples, canned goods and so much more can be purchased. Ingredients to make complete meals, whether breakfast, lunch or dinner, can be easily found on the mobile market.
